


Prayer of St. Francis





College Bowl 2002

The College Bowl team representing St. Bonaventure placed fourth at a regional tournament held in Syracuse Feb. 15-17. It was the highest finish that any team representing St. Bonaventure has accomplished.

The team finished round robin play with a record of 9-4. Bonas beat Canisius, Buffalo State, SUNY Geneseo, RIT, Alfred State, St. Lawrence, St. John Fisher and Elmira. Bonaventure also upset high-ranked Syracuse 235-45 in one of the tournaments most surprising outcomes. Bonaventure entered the second phase of the tournament which is a four-team double-elimination playoff. Bonaventure lost to the University of Rochester in the first round and then came close to upsetting eventual finalist and defending champion Cornell. The University of Rochester won the tournament and headed to Kansas State University for the national tournament.

The team was chosen from the on-campus tournament that took place in November. The team consisted of the two high scorers from the championship team as well as the next three overall leading scorers. The team consisted of seniors Stephen Frontera, Mike Ford, Josh Morcelle, Dave DuBois and sophomore Mike DeRan. The team advisors were David Matz, professor of classical languages, and Lauren De La Vars, associate professor of English.







When Bonnie fans found out that last year's head coach. Jim Baron, would not be returning, no one knew what to think. But their worries were soon put to rest when it was announced that Jan van Breda Kolff would be the new head coach. As of April 10, 2001, van Breda Kolff became the 17th coach at St. Bonaventure University. His basketball background is outstanding as a player and coach. The new Bona leader was a player and coach in the Italian professional league from 1983-85. He spent nine years as a professional player in the NBA and ABA and was an impressive fifth overall pick in the '74 ABA draft; he was chosen by the Denver Nuggets. His college-level coaching career began as an assistant coach at Princeton from 1987-91. van Breda Kolff took the reins as head coach at Cornell (91-93), Vanderbilt (93-99), and most recently Pepperdine (99-01). He holds an impressive record of 174-128 (.576) at those schools, two NCAA and four NIT tourney appearances. He received a wave of support from the Bonaventure community all over. This past season he has shown his dedication to the Bonnies and St. Bonaventure University.




Along with trips to the U.S. embassy, the students also attended academic lectures given by six English-speaking Chinese professors on subjects such as culture, history, politics, business practices and language.










March for Life 2002 & Black Voices for Peace Washington, D.C.





After 80 amazing years, Leo E. Keenan continued his journey with Christ. On January 27, 2002, the beloved English professor died following a brief illness.

He was born July 20, 1921, in Olean, a son of Leo and Ellen Keenan. On Aug. 21, 1948, at St. Mary of the Angels Church in Olean, he married Ann Finlay, who survives. Professor Keenan received a bachelor of arts degree in English from St. Bonaventure University in 1947, and a master of arts degree from Cornell University the

following year. After a brief teaching stint at Niagara University, he returned in 1949 to his alma mater, where he taught for more than 50 years.

In October 1999, Leslie C. Quick III, chair of the Board of Trustees, donated \$2 million for two faculty development endowments at St. Bonaventure, naming one after Professor Keenan. The Leo Keenan Faculty Development Endowment for the Improvement of Teaching and Learning now provides funds to faculty engaged in activities designed to improve the quality of the teaching and learning process at St. Bonaventure. In making the gift, Quick said he hoped to encourage others to imitate Keenan's "selfless dedication" to the profession.

A professor of English, he taught popular public speaking classes. Outside the University, he was in great demand as a public speaker and master of ceremonies, leading one colleague to crown him "Toastmaster General of the Southern Tier."

Professor Keenan also served as director of the summer, evening and extension programs from 1963 to 1972, and as director of continuing education from 1972 to 1975. He received the Faculty Recognition Award for Special Services in 1991.

He coached the University's golf team from 1967 to 1987, compiling a final record of 172-90-10 including three unbeaten squads. St. Bonaventure's annual fall golf invitational was renamed for Professor Keenan in 1994. Every year, between 15-20 NCAA Division I teams compete for the title of the Leo Keenan Collegiate Invitational at Bartlett Country Club in Olean, N.Y. fittingly, St. Bonaventure won the team championship this past October, its first title since 1997.

Professor Keenan was inducted into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993, and continued to serve on the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee. He was named Alumnus of the Year in 1987, the 40th anniversary of his graduation, and was inducted into the Seneca Battalion ROTC Hall of Fame in fall 1999, the only person to have been inducted into all three of the University's Halls of Fame.

St. Bonaventure awarded him an honorary doctorate during Commencement 2000.

"To have known Leo was a rare privilege, for he was the consummate gentleman, teacher, father, and husband," said University president Dr. Robert J. Wickenheiser. "He was one of the best reflections of what Bonaventure is all about, and in losing him, as in losing Fr. Gervase White just two short weeks ago, we have lost another of Bonaventure's giants as well as a great deal of its history over the past 50-plus years. In the minds and hearts of all of us Leo will forever remain 'Prof 1.'"
