










DEDICATION

IN MEMORIAM

A foremost American Franciscan scholar, educator and biblical authority, Very Reverend Thomas Plassman, O.F.M., rector of Christ the King Seminary, St. Bonaventure University, died Friday, February 13, 1959.


Known to thousands as "Father Tom", the German-born Franciscan Friar had been on the faculty of St. Bonaventure University for over 45 years, first as a professor, then 29 years as its president; and more recently, since 1952, as Rector of Christ the King Seminary.

Born Bernard Plassman, March 19, 1879, in Westphalia, Germany, he came to America at the age of fifteen and took his B.A. and M.A. degrees at Quincy College, Illinois, entering the Franciscan Order in September 1898. His theological studies were in Washington, D.C. The priesthood by Archbishop Diomede Falconio, O.F.M. (later Cardinal), who had been the second president of St. Bonaventure University. Father Thomas became its eleventh president in 1920.

In accordance with the exhortation of St. Francis, Father Tom became known, in a reverent sense, as "God's Pickpocket", because he begged from alumni, friends, strangers, and all denominations, to achieve the goal he had visualized for St. Bonaventure University.

On October 7, 1958, as a "Living Memorial" to Father Thomas, St. Bonaventure University marked the beginning of its second century of Franciscan service to education by naming its new million dollar arts building for the Franciscan Friar who had guided the institution through its most ambitious construction program during his 29 years as president. In the presence of the Apostolic Delegate to the United States, the building was named "Father Thomas Plassman Hall" in honor of the legendary friar who, "revered and beloved by all, spent 40 years making people feel at home at St. Bonaventure."

CLASS HISTORY

A history cannot be written in four short years. This is only the beginning of a story of men and women brought together at a small school nestled in the foothills of the Alleghenies.

Although it has been four years, it seems like only yesterday when we began to explore the true meaning of a Catholic college education and the Bonaventure spirit. At that time perhaps we had the Bonaventure spirit through following the basketball standings in the sports pages, through a favorite uncle who was himself a Bonaventure Man, or through a man from our hometown who wore a brown robe and spoke highly of the school.

But we had to find out for ourselves. We wanted to prepare for our later lives after first having found out just what the real meaning of that life is. We sought a knowledge of our Creator, our fellow man, and ourselves.

We came from all over the country — from the sidewalks of New York, from a small midwestern town, or from two years overseas through the courtesy of Uncle Sam. But we had one thing in common: our determination to become Bonaventure Men and Women.

This dream seemed very far away that first day when we stepped off the train, being very careful to show off the Bonaventure sticker on our luggage. The dream kept getting further and further away when rules taught us that the ties of mama's apron strings were irrevocably severed. Physical hazing was enforced that year and we banded together to hate the sophomore class.

Revenge was ours, however, when covered with mud, we won the Frosh-Soph contest. We had the pleasure of having the last Frosh Day and Senator Jim Luke became the particular target for pent up feelings. After it was all over, we found out that the sophomores weren't such bad guys after all — we were accepted.

The last Bonaventure homecoming was held during our freshman year; we felt we had come home, and Bonaventure was that new home. We went to the polls for the first time as university students and elected Pat Reddy our class president.

Our freshman year was not all happiness, however, as Rev. Anselm Krieger, O.F.M., gentleman and athlete, died. Happenings such as this served to bring us back to the reality of attaching a purpose to our lives.

Life also took on a rather sober meaning twice a year when we tried to cram a semester's material into our heads the night before the finals. We cursed ourselves for neglecting the day-to-day study, resolved to do better next time, and invariably made the same mistake again.

As much as we liked St. Bonas, we were anxious to get home for summer vacation. When we got there, things were somehow different. The Franciscan magic had begun to weave a spell over us, and we liked it.

When we came back to Bonas in the fall, we were big men on campus. We were great and we knew it. We were sophomores; we acted the part. Injustices given us the previous year were remembered, improved upon, and put into action whenever we spied an innocent frosh.

We initiated a highly successful dance called the Weasel Hop. Three of our men — Harvey Salmastrelli, Jay Murtha, and Pat Reddy were selected to wear the blue senatorial jacket with a big "59" on it.

The high point of our sophomore year was the selection of our basketball team to the National Invitation Tournament. We packed our bags and headed for the bright lights of the big city.

After the initial thrill of being an upperclassman had worn off, we settled down to do some serious thinking. We began to realize the confidence and respect a simple brown robe could engender.

Our junior year began in a blaze of excitement with the opening of the centennial year. We felt humble because the university was giving her best to us as she had to countless others for the past century. Francis Cardinal Spellman came to help us open the centenary on October 4. Sixteen bishops and the governor of New York State were on hand to wish us well.

Plans were announced for a new Liberal Arts building, and we watched the progress on the building while we mounted that we would graduate a few months too soon to attend classes in it.

Centennial events followed each other in rapid succession during that year. We had the opportunity in participating in numerous symposia. We began to suspect that our education still had a very long way to go.

Filled with the Christmas spirit, we had the annual kids' Christmas party for the underprivileged children of the area. Our appreciation of the beauties of Cattaraugus County winters became somewhat weakened within the next few months as a flu epidemic hit campus. We sniffled and sneezed our way through the January finals while the infirmary did a booming business.

Things got better in March, however, when

we accepted a bid to the N.I.T. for the second year in a row. Our winning streak in the Armory had been advanced to an amazing 77 games. We also had the satisfaction of taking two games apiece from our Little Three rivals Niagara and Canisius.

Determined not to be outdone in anything, we brought the sounds of the Duke, Duke Ellington, to the Armory for our prom. We all climbed the Stairway to the Stars and indeed had stars in our eyes for the next few weeks whenever we thought of that night. A special feature of our prom was the Ring ceremony during which we were presented our class rings by our dates.

Politics came to our attention again as we cast our ballots for our officers for the last time. We elected Ernie D'Aristotle, who had previously been named junior of the year, to his third term as class president. Dave Krahe, Ed Karl, and Tom Doddridge were picked to fill out the roster.

We chose Sal Guarnaccia, Howie Dowdall, Bill Condy and Joe Guinta to represent us in the senate. The entire student body voted to elect Sal senate president, the first veteran in a decade to achieve that distinction.

During the summer, some of us were treated to a luxurious vacation at Fort Sill. Keeping one eye on the tarantulas and other such enemies, we were sure that we had become soldiers in the best Minute Man traditions.

When we came back to Bonas, we were on the final step toward our bachelor's degrees. By now, Bonaventure had become a second home to us and we thought with some regret that we would be leaving it soon. But that didn't stop us from living the last year to the hilt.

A note of sadness touched our return, how-

ever, when we discovered that Griff's Super Atomic Derby Duo were not on hand to greet us. An era had passed — the machine age was here at last.

Horses might have been on the way out, but the coeds were on the way in with the establishment of the first women's dorm at Bonas. Part of St. Elizabeth Academy was rechristened St. Elizabeth Hall, and the coeds moved in hoping that this would encourage more girls to come to Bonaventure.

The Apostolic Delegate to the United States graced our campus to help us inaugurate Bonaventure's second century. We watched progress on the new Liberal Arts Building out of the corner of our eye and speculated to ourselves that it would be a fine place for our children to receive a higher education.

Pope Pius XII died during October of our senior year and for the first time in our lives, we knew the emptiness of not having a supreme leader of our Church, even if only for a few days.

The Pope's death almost put a damper on our plans for the best Fall Festival ever. True to our tradition of doing things on a grand scale, we planned an entirely new approach to one of the fall's leading social events. Our Festival was built around the appearance of the Crew Cuts. Although the weather left something to be desired, our Festival was a great financial success.

We saw the Hand of God touch another of His priests that year with the sudden death of Rev. Alan Glynn, O.F.M. We did the best we could by the energetic young Friar — and wished we could have done more.

The Dramatics Club which had been rejuvenated in our junior year was officially named the Garret Theatre Players and its first production under the new name was the musical Girl Crazy. Seniors Dick Sroka and Gail Kennedy had the leading roles, and the show proved very successful.

The year wore on . . . more floor parties at Christmastime . . . more basketball victories . . . more exams and midnight oil . . . another prom . . . a better understanding of why we were chosen by a Power higher than ourselves to be Bonaventure Men and Women.

The days were not always easy; we griped about tests, and our roommate, and our failures each in its turn.

We realized that it was time for us to leave; another class was coming to take our place as seniors. We asked ourselves again our original questions of the meaning of our education and the Bonaventure spirit.

Like Socrates so many years ago, we realized that our strength and wisdom lay in realizing what we did not know. We had finished our four years at Bonaventure, but we knew our education had only just begun, and it would continue throughout our lives in whatever walk of life we should choose.

And the thing which would make our education grow? That was this Bonaventure spirit — the social ability to meet men on equal terms and get along with them; the educational ability to use our natural curiosity to learn more about the many things of which we are ignorant; the spiritual ability to attach a deeper meaning to successes and failures, the pleasures and disappointments which we met and would continue to meet in everyday living.

Bonaventure had given us everything she knew how to give, and we left hoping that someday, in some way, we would be able to repay her.
