# A STUDENT HIMSELF

I congratulate you on having successfully completed your college career. The whole faculty and administration join me in commending and complimenting you.


We are proud to have played a part in your growing into self-reliant men and women of character, capable of further perfecting and using your God-given abilities to better the world in which you will live.

This I would ask you to remember all the days of your life.






## MILITARY BALL








Each year the students of St. Bonaventure display the true spirit of Franciscan education by sponsoring a Christmas Party for the underprivileged children of the community.



The varsity hit a deadly 52% and ruled the boards in the contest which saw nine Bonnies contribute to the scoring total and the entire squad seeing considerable action.




## OKLAHOMA CITY 79 ST. BONAVENTURE 71

High for the varsity was Carter with 24. Butler and Stappenbeck each tallied 19.






## ST. BONAVENTURE 84 VILLA MADONNA 62

Satalin led the scoring parade of the first half with 12, while Ahearn had 10 and Stappenbeck 9. The Indians led at half-time, 45-27. George Carter finished as high scorer for the game with 18 points, while Paul Stappenbeck contributed 13.



## ST. BONAVENTURE 92 XAVIER 72

The Bonnies exploded to their first impressive win of the season against the previously undefeated Musketeers of Xavier.

Veterans Paul Stappenbeck and George Carter dominated the first half with 17 and 10 points respectively as they shot the Bonnies to a 42-31 lead at half-time.

The sophomores sparkled in the second half. Bill Butler dumped in 19 points and collected 16 rebounds. Wheeling and dealing from underneath, the strong forward wowed the Buffalo audience. Jim Satalin and Ed Ahearn chipped in with 14 and 10 points as the youthful Bonnies showed their potential.

The 92-72 win ran the varsity record to 3-1 and established the Brown Indians as an Eastern power to be reckoned with.

## ST. BONAVENTURE 97 TEXAS SOUTHERN 76

Texas Southern proved a lot tougher than expected, but the Bonnies had too much firepower in the Armory as they took their fourth win of the season, 97-76. The big men for the Indians were the two fine forwards, Butler and Carter, as they ripped the nets for 26 apiece.

The first half ended at 42-36 as the Bonnies started slowly. They shot only 39%, but gained the lead with a strong 32-22 edge off the boards.

In the second half, the Indians blended a good shooting percentage with their rebounding edge to finish the game 40 for 80 from the field and 17 for 23 from the foul line.



## ST. BONAVENTURE 75 SAN FRANCISCO STATE 57

Bill Butler was the Bonnies brightest star as he paced the varsity to victory number five against San Francisco State. Combining 14 field goals with 4 free throws, he was the first Bona player to go over 30 points for a single game in the fledging season.

Co-captain Roger Bauer buoyed the ineffective sophomore backcourt of Satalin and Ahearn, coming off the bench for 10 points. George Carter was the only other Bonnie to reach double figures hitting for a 16 point total. The Brown Indians were just too strong for the Golden Gaters as the final score read 75-57.





## ST. BONAVENTURE 122 ST. JOSEPH'S (INDIANA) 76

Stepping into the friendly confines of the Olean Armory the Brown Indians roared to a new all time scoring record against a respectable St. Joseph's of Indiana club. 122 points were recorded by the red hot Bonnies as the varsity shot a blistering 59.6 per cent from the floor.

The first half ended with the Bonnies up 50-28. The second half is what iced the already sweet victory. 72 points fell through the Armory hoop as six Indians broke into double figures. Bill Butler continued his early season rampage leading the squad with an even 30, next came Carter with 26, then Stappenbeck, Ahearn, Satalin and Bauer with 26, 17, 17, and 11, respectively.

The St. Joe's tilt considered to be an essential tune-up for the Quaker City snapped the previous record of 115 points set by Tom Stith and Company in 1960.

The final tally read 122-76.

## ST. BONAVENTURE 100 BALDWIN-WALLACE 67

The Brown Indians reached the century mark against Baldwin-Wallace in the Armory, 100-67. It was the third time in eight games that the varsity had broken the hundred barrier.

Two B's, Butler and Bauer, brought the Bonnies victory this time as the talented sophomore tallied 26 points and the experienced co-captain steered the attack.

Down 15-10, Coach Weise put Bauer into the lineup and he in turn injected the impetus necessary to rev up the Bonnie attack. From that point on it was all Bonaventure as the varsity climbed up to a comfortable 46-34 halftime lead. The win closed out the early segment of the varsity season with a respectable 7-1 record.





## QUAKER CITY TOURNEY

The Quaker City was to provide a national limelight for the Bonnies as they steamed into Philadelphia sporting a 7-1 slate and a plus 90 points per game average.

Temple snuffed out the light and Brigham Young let out the steam as the varsity was sent back to New York State with two punishing losses.

The Owls of Temple came out pressing and zoning and totally confusing the Bonnie offense. Paul Stappenbeck hit his first jump shot and then missed the rest of his efforts for the entire afternoon. The Temple zone drew in tight as a drum and the strong rebounding Bonnies were badly beaten off the boards by Jim Williams and Kenny Morgan. Down by nine at halftime, the varsity showed momentary life in the final frame pulling up only to lose, 84-72.

Third ranked Brigham Young after being upset by hometown La Salle in their opening round contest came back against Bonaventure 99-87 and bounced Bona right out of the tourney.

Paced by Dick Nemelka's brilliant 40 point barrage, the Cougars raced out to a 27 point lead with but 11 minutes remaining. John Riley came off the bench and the slumbering Stappenbeck smarting from his dismal Temple performance turned the greatest effort of his career as the Bonnies cut the lead to 8 with but a minute remaining.

Tall Paul popped in 28 points and pulled down 22 rebounds in the loss. Carter added 22, 17 coming in the second half.





## ST. BONAVENTURE 96 DUQUESNE 73

The Iron Dukes from Pittsburgh were looking for an easy win over the drooping Bonnies but were sent back to Steel Town with a 96-73 pasting.

A surprising contender in the East, Duquesne proved no match for the rejuvenated Bonnies. Paul Stappenbeck took control of the boards, while Carter, Hazard and Satalin, as well as Stappenbeck, tossed in double figure performances.

Carter led all scorers with 23. Hazard came off the bench and bucketed 6 of 9 shots, Stappenbeck finished with 19 and Satalin with 13.

Co-captain John Riley rejoined the line-up and turned in a heartening performance with his pinpoint passing, deft steals, and overall field strategy.





## ST. BONAVENTURE 92 NIAGARA 65

The Mayor was there; the press was there; the clergy was there; and so was the entire student body. All packed into the antiquated Olean Armory's 2,200 seating capacity to bid the old "snake pit" a fond adieu against traditional rival Niagara.


Fever ran high on campus as many felt the Purple Eagles might steal the thunder from the Bonnie party just as they had done in the famed one-hundredth victory game of six years ago.

The introductory speeches by the Very Rev. Francis William Kearney, O.F.M., president of the university, Mayor Husted of Olean, and by Mr. Leo Keenan, were followed by the ball game and the Bonnies proved that they were still nearly invincible in the Armory, romping Niagara 92-65.

## ST. BONAVENTURE 80 CANISIUS 76



Satalin, Carter and Butler all totaled 20 points or better for the Bonnies as many of the metropolitan press looked on.



## ST. BONAVENTURE 71 DUQUESNE 70

Only a handful of spectators were present to see the Bonnies down the Dukes 71-70 in the cavernous Pittsburgh Civic Center as the worst blizzard in years swirled outside.

Duquesne held the lead throughout the game until the final buzzer. The Bonnies were so cold that by halftime they had scored but 20 points. With less than two minutes left, they were down by 8 and with 17 seconds remaining they still trailed by 3. John Riley sunk a critical foul shot. The Iron Dukes took the ball in and for some reason sophomore Ron Guziak literally threw the game away by missing a jump shot from point blank range with three seconds on the clock. Bill Butler pocketed the rebound and in one motion heaved it to John Riley three-quarters of the way down the court. Riley hit Carter streaking for the bucket and George banked it in on the buzzer giving the Bonnies their thirteenth win of the season.

## ST. BONAVENTURE 73 DE PAUL 69

DePaul coach Ray Meyer said before the game, "The big centers don't hurt us; it's the big forwards." George Carter proved that he was indeed a wiser sage than he had intended.

Recording their sixth straight win and their most impressive of the season, the Bonnies belted talented DePaul 73-69.

The contest divided into one man halves as Jim Satalin bombed in 21 points and George Carter obliterated the opposition with 25. The Brown Indians were so hapless that they outshot and outrebounded their opponents only to hand the ball over twenty-five times on turnovers and shoddy ball handling.



A tune up for the return match with Canisius, none of the Brown and White was spectacular but all were effective as Bona racked up its 15th win.





## ST. BONAVENTURE 66 CANISIUS 61







Fledging Ithaca College gave the Bonnies an easy tune-up for their Eastern swing as the varsity lifted its record to 3-2 against intercollegiate competition.





